Language Area

This month we will have some changes in the Chinese classroom. Younger children will focus on ㄣ、ㄒ、ㄗ、ㄛ and 部首禾、冫、夕、讠、钅 and tracing lines of different shapes. We will work on the poem 三字经 and 江南. The English class will work on the sounds for Tt, Jj, Ll, Uu, dr, th, ing. Older children will work on blue reading areas and the poem is Summertime.

Art and Music

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Practical Life Area

We will learn to put shoes on and take them off, use the Bow Dressing Frame and sewing cards, and how to cough and sneeze using a tissue or their arm. The students will also practice using a spoon and a ladle.

Math Area

The older children will learn 1 to 1000, bank games, golden beads and will focus on solving problems and multiplication with chart and board. Younger children will focus on 1 to 20, tracing numbers and counting with beads and spindle box and addition and subtraction boards.

Sensorial Area

The students will work with the knobless cylinders and extensions. These activities will help children develop their fine motor skills, and their understanding of color and sizes.

- Red cylinder: Each cylinder decreases in diameter, height stays constant.
- Yellow cylinder: Each cylinder decreases in both diameter and height.
- Green cylinder: Each cylinder decreases in diameter and increases in height.
- Blue cylinder: Each cylinder decreases in height, diameter stays constant.

Following grading language: tall, taller, tallest; thin, thinner, thinnest; thick, thicker, thickest; short, shorter, shortest.
