Language Area

This month, students will focus on the Chinese sounds ㄛ, ㄜ, ㄝ and ㄟ. Older children will begin exploring phonics, reading and writing using the blue series. We will practice using punctuation correctly to build complete sentences and paragraphs. Students will also engage in matching activities with cards and objects. In addition, we will read the poem 春曉.

Art and Music

In the English classroom, students will sing “I Am a Little Shamrock” and “The Rainbow Song”. During art time, we will create spring and St. Patrick’s Day crafts. In Chinese classroom, we will sing 過城門 and 快樂的小鳥.

Science and Geography

This month, we will explore the nature table. Each child is invited to bring an interesting natural item from around the world, such as rocks, seeds, fossils, plants or leaves to share with classmates. All items will be returned at the end of the month. Thank you for helping your child prepare for this special project.

In Zoology, we will study frogs and learn about animals that live both on land and in water. Students will work with 3 parts cards and explore land and water forms. We will also mix primary colors to create secondary colors and conduct a “Climb a Rainbow” experiment using markers, water and paper towels.

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Practical Life Area

This month, students will practice using the lacing frame, proper handwashing techniques, sweeping and pouring water into a narrow neck bottle with a funnel. They will also learn how to wash baby.

Math Area

Younger children will continue building number recognition and understanding with 0-9, using a variety of hands on materials. They will also practice basic addition and subtraction with different materials and worksheets. Older students will work with tens and hundred, explore numbers 10-99 using the bead materials, practice with the Sequin ten boards and cards.

Sensorial Area

This month, students will explore the geometric solids set. This work introduces early geometry concepts and helps children compare different three-dimensional shapes. It strengthens concentration, coordination, independence, and problem-solving skills. The set includes a cylinder, cube, ellipsoid, cone, sphere, square base pyramid, ovoid, rectangular prism and triangular prism.
